

**SANTA BARBARA CITY COLLEGE (SBCC)**  
**2009-10 CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION BREADTH PATTERN**

The General Education Breadth Pattern (GEB) for the California State University system (CSU) specifies courses within subject areas that will satisfy the 39 lower division G.E.B. requirements at any campus of the California State University system. Students can transfer up to 70 semester units from the community college(s) attended.

**II. CSU GENERAL EDUCATION BREADTH OBJECTIVES AND REQUIREMENTS**

SBCC strongly recommends completion of the SBCC-CSU lower division G. E. B. pattern (39 units minimum) prior to transfer. Completion of the CSU GE Breadth pattern qualifies students to receive a Certificate of Achievement from SBCC. Completion of the G.E. requirements is not required for admission to CSU. However, students who do not complete all the lower division G.E. requirements will not be fully "certified." As a result, these students will be subject to additional G.E. requirements after transfer. Some campuses are moving toward requiring full completion of lower division general education before transfer. Please refer to the respective CSU campus catalogue for campus-specific G.E.B. requirements. Even though a course may be listed in more than one area on CSU GE, a course may only be counted in one area for certification. **In order to graduate from the CSU, a minimum of 9 additional upper-division semester units from areas "B", "C", and "D" must be completed at the student's CSU campus of choice after transfer.** Students have the option of completing IGETC to fulfill the G.E requirements for CSU. **III. SBCC's CSU CERTIFICATION PROCESS:** Certification request forms can be obtained in the Transfer Center.

A) Students transferring to the CSU must request that official SBCC transcripts be sent from the SBCC Admissions and Records Office to the CSU of their choice. A separate request for G.E. certification must be submitted to the Transfer Center after the student's last semester in attendance at SBCC.

B) Coursework completed at other regionally-accredited two or four-year colleges or universities may be used in the CSU certification process if the content is appropriate to meet GE requirements. Course work from other California community colleges (CCC) will be placed in the CSU GE category listed by that campus. Courses must have been on that college's CSU GE list when the courses were completed.

C) Students must attach copies of their official transcripts from other accredited colleges or universities to their request for CSU certification unless they already are on file in the SBCC Admissions and Records office.

	<b>CSU GRADUATION REQUIREMENT IN U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION AND AMERICAN IDEALS</b> This requirement may be met before or after transfer to the CSU. At the discretion of the CSU campus granting the degree, courses meeting this requirement may also be counted toward certification in general education. Students satisfy this CSU graduation requirement through coursework in three areas: US-1, US-2 and US-3. A student must take one course from each of the three areas.
